a. How does David describe the heart and ways of God towards his own who sin?

b. What promises of God did David rely on or truths about God's character? What truths about himself did he recall? Think of a time recently when you were confronted with sin and how you responded. In what ways have you responded in similar fashion to David, in what ways do your responses need to drastically change based on Psalm 51?
